Michigan FCCLA Members' Accident Insurance Policy

Michigan FCCLA has purchased an accident insurance policy for each dues-paying member. This policy will cover all members listed on your affiliation form for any accidental injury occurring during a chapter, region, state or national FCCLA activity, meeting or conference.

Michigan FCCLA Membership Guidelines

1. Each school should submit a single Affiliation Form per school. (If a school has multiple chapters, hours, or teachers, submit them all on **one single affiliation form**).
2. Affiliation forms are due to National FCCLA by November 30 to receive the \$10.00 rate for state dues, special services and membership pins. After December 1, the rate for state dues is \$20.00.
3. Dues must be received by National FCCLA by March 1 for STAR Events participants, Power of One awards, and Be Part of It awards, and to receive complimentary State Leadership Conference registration for 20% membership increase.
4. National Dues are \$9.00 per member. State dues are \$10.00 per person paid before December 1 (for a total of \$19.00), and \$20 per member after December 1 (for a total of \$29.00 per member). The state dues include accident insurance for each member. Each student must pay both the state and national dues.
5. **All chapters must have at least nine (9) student members (both state and national).**
6. National FCCLA will send membership cards and materials directly to each chapter.
7. Payment must be received at the time of affiliation.
8. State and National membership fees are non-transferable and non-refundable.
9. All State Leadership Conference participants must be paid members by March 1.
10. If an individual registered for the State Leadership Conference drops out of the Family and Consumer Sciences/Early Childhood/Teacher Cadet/Fashion Design/Interior Design program prior to the State Leadership Conference, or does not attend the conference, that individual is still required to pay his/her membership fees.

State Membership Recognition Programs

Michigan FCCLA has a goal to increase membership by at least 10%. We need your help to achieve that goal.

We are pleased to announce three statewide incentive programs for chapters to increase their membership.

1. Michigan FCCLA will provide a membership lapel pin for each member of any chapter that increases its membership and submits the affiliation form to Michigan FCCLA by November 1.
2. For chapters who increase their membership by 20% (compared to 2008-2009) by March 1, one complimentary registration to the State Leadership Conference will be provided.
3. Chapters increasing their membership by at least 5 more members than 2008-2009 by March 1 will receive recognition in the Gimme Five Program. Details are on the following page.

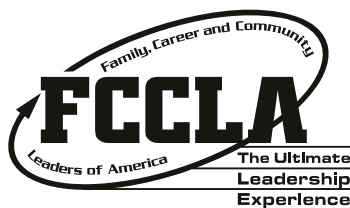

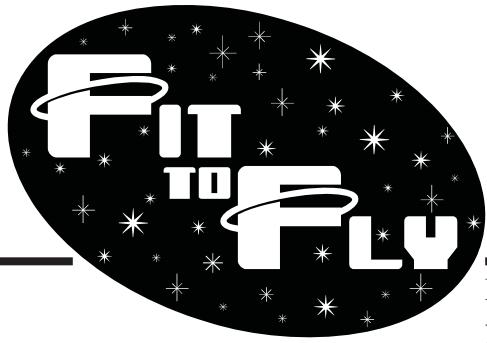

State Community Service Project

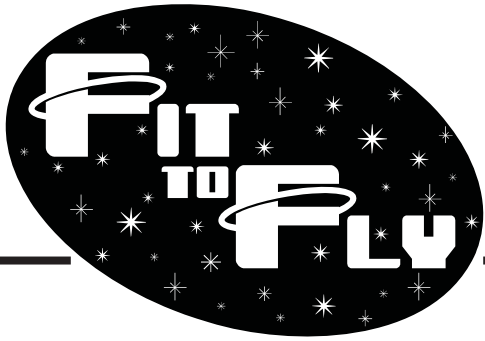
Michigan FCCLA is challenging you to become Fit to Fly this year with our State Community Service Project- it's **Out of This**

World! We're encouraging our members to choose a project in your school or community to promote healthy lifestyles.

This year the Michigan FCCLA State Community Service project is based around Michigan and its communities becoming healthier. A list of example activities that would promote a healthier community is below. In order to receive a Bronze award the chapter must complete one activity, complete two activities for a Silver award, and three for the Gold award. Feel free to do something that's not on the list - be creative!

Project Ideas

- Participate in the "Fuel Up to Play" program available at schoolwellnesskit.org.
- Hold a community wide 5K race to promote exercise.
- Using pedometers, hold a contest to see who walks the most in a day.
- Promote healthy lunch food items throughout your school and community.
- Write a letter to the editor in your local newspaper promoting what your school is doing to become healthier.
- Hold a seminar on exercise compulsive disorder to show how to create a healthy balance.
- Submit an application for the National Program, Student Body.
- Make a radio or video public service announcement about healthy lifestyles which could also be shown at the Michigan FCCLA State Leadership Conference.
- Write letters to your school board requesting healthier food choices at lunch.
- Hold a low-fat bake sale.
- Hold a community-wide truck pulling contest.
- Have an Ultimate Frisbee tournament.
- Create a brochure about becoming healthier and pass it around the community.
- Hold a school-wide (or even just your class) field day with athletic activities.
- Hold a fundraiser for Feed The Children to help those who are malnourished.
- Hold a picnic with only healthy foods.
- Hold a 24 Hour Relay to show that if you can walk for 24 hours, then you can be drug free for a day, a month, a lifetime.
- Hold a 24 Hour Dance Relay.
- Enroll your chapter in a stress management class.
- Get the community involved in an event that involves walking to an area and socializing instead of driving to the movies or to a restaurant, showing that walking as an exercise is fun.
- Inform the community about the consequences of obesity.
- Hold a day where everybody walks or bikes to school .
- Create a cheat jar - every time you do something unhealthy put a quarter into a jar. At the end of the semester, donate all the money to the Children's Miracle Network as part of the National Outreach Project.
- Have at least 5% of your chapter go onto mypyramid.gov and create their own personalized food pyramid, then actually use the pyramid that was developed.
- Hold an assembly to talk to younger kids about eating healthy.
- Keep a food diary and compare it to the national list of expected food intake.
- Hold a community-wide pig chase.

You'll have new experiences, learn about yourself, and feel pride in reaching a goal. Plus, you can earn recognition from your local chapter, Michigan, and National FCCLA. Students Taking On Prevention®

STOP the Violence Chapter Training Materials

Today's students are no strangers to violence, but many feel powerless to do anything about it. Like their peers, members of FCCLA are concerned about violence committed by and to youth in the United States. Stop the Violence - Students Taking On Prevention is a comprehensive, national FCCLA peer-to-peer outreach initiative that empowers young people to recognize, report, and reduce the potential for youth violence in their schools and communities.

Michigan FCCLA has trained individuals in the past through a multi-day training workshop. This year we're glad to be able to expand this opportunity for more chapters to participate through a video series provided by National FCCLA. FCCLA has recorded the training exercises on VHS tapes so a chapter can implement their own training. The videos are broken up into nine (9) sessions, taking up approximately ten class sessions (based on a 50-60 minute class period). The program is designed to combine in-class activities with the video presentation. The videos come with an in-depth instruction manual with information about coordinating the training, and instructions to complete the activities. If your chapter chooses to participate, a program CD and program video (separate from the training videos) will be provided for each chapter, and training materials provided for each participant.

There is no cost to your chapter to participate; however, there will be a \$50.00 fee if the tapes are not returned to Michigan FCCLA in good condition within three weeks. In order to participate, your chapter must affiliate with Michigan FCCLA before any materials will be provided. The training materials and CD are yours to keep.

A chapter can earn this recognition either by participating in the Gimme Five Campaign, achieve at least one of the recognition categories in the “Be Part of It” Membership Campaign, or increase their membership by at least 20%. See pages 6 for details.

State Community Service Project – Goal: To reach out to our communities

Fit to Fly is this year’s statewide community service project. Chapters are encouraged to educate and make changes to improve the health of our schools and communities. Chapters must achieve the bronze level of this project for it to apply for the Five Star Chapter Award. See page 15 for details.

Leadership Development – Goal: To develop stronger leaders through FCCLA

A strong chapter helps members develop leadership skills by using the FCCLA one of the National Programs, Leaders at Work or Dynamic Leadership, or participating in the Fall Leadership Conference.

FCCLA/FHA-HERO Alumni– Goal: To keep the spirit of Michigan FCCLA alive

A chapter must affiliate at least five new Alumni members. The Michigan FCCLA/FHA-HERO Alumni Enrollment Form can be found on page 14.

Legislative Involvement – Goal: To make legislators aware of our organization

A chapter must complete an activity or project in which they make contact with a legislator and inform him or her about our organization, its purposes, and its programs.

National Programs – Goal: To keep Michigan involved at the National level

A chapter must do a project or activity involving any of the National FCCLA Programs (i.e. Power of One, Families First, Career Connection, etc.). Please note that a National Program cannot be counted twice (i.e. Leaders at Work for both the Leadership Development goal and the National Programs goal).
