Evaluators need to arrive for orientation by 8:00 a.m., and all judging will be complete by 1:00 p.m. Lunch is provided.



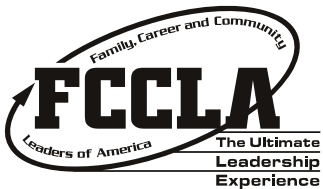
